Remembering Allan Einseln

I will always remember Allan for his enthusiasm as a bottle digger and collector. He delighted in finding even common bottles or shards, and he made an effort to educate everyone he met about his collection.

Allan served as vice president of the Potomac Bottle Collectors for two years, and, even before he took this position, he helped to find several interesting speakers for our meetings. Allan was proud to be a part of our club. When he was out digging, he would always introduce himself to passers-by as a member of the Potomac Bottle Collectors. This occasionally worried some of us who noted that the club was not sponsoring digs, but it also occasionally succeeded in bringing new people to our meetings.

I remember Allan for two things besides bottle collecting. The first was his passion for helping homeless people. He was willing to take food and water wherever homeless individuals needed it, even though he knew they were as likely to curse him as to thank him for his efforts. The second was Allan's steadfast religious belief. He did not fear death but was completely confident it would bring him to a better place.

Allan suffered a variety of health problems and missed some recent meetings due to a kidney infection. Still, his death was completely unexpected, and we have not yet found an appropriate memorial for him. We believe that his family will designate an organization that helps homeless people in the local area.

Bottle Show Report

Ed Faulkner's report below comes from the Richmond club newsletter <u>The Digger</u>. I concur with Ed's assessment of the show's success. Richmond has been steadily building its show over the past few years, and the Showplace Annex appears to be an excellent location for continued expansion.



2001 Show Report by Ed Faulkner

The 2001 Richmond Show appears to be another success to be chalked up to the credit of show chairman Judy Foles. We had approximately 250 attending, with 60 dealers at 92 tables. We also had an impressive 9 displays set against a freshly pained Showplace Annex

There was a pretty good sized crew for show set-up on Friday evening. After the tables were arranged and covered, those present were treated to pizza, subs, and sodas by the club. After this everyone was allowed to bring their table materials in and set up their tables or displays if they wished.

The weather cooperated nicely with us; the promised rain started only after everyone had brought in their sales items. Dealers were treated to a breakfast of sausage and egg biscuits, doughnuts, coffee, and juice. Dealers were also given a "goodie bag" with Richmond souvenirs, tools key chains, and food samples donated by local merchants. The Richmond club really treats its dealers well. There were also door prizes given out to show attendees.

The rain seemed to spread the attendance out through the day so there was a fairly steady stream of people coming in up to the end of the show. We had 19 people who paid the \$15 to come in at 7:30, and this helped our show budget a lot, while not greatly impairing the dealers' chance to do some buying before the public arrived at 9 AM.

There were collection jars for the Red Cross and Sgt. Santa this year in lieu of a 50/50 raffle. The Red Cross received \$42, and Sgt. Santa \$293 in direct donations, and the club will also contribute to each after a final accounting of the show is made.

Everyone that I talked to seemed pleased with their sales and plans to be back next year. I know that this was our best Richmond show thus far. Hope to see you here next year!







The Potomac Bottle Collectors (PBC) is a non-profit antique bottle club serving collectors from the District of Columbia, Northern Virginia, and the Maryland suburbs. The club was founded in 1972 and continues to be a dynamic, active organization. While some club members are diggers and general collectors of old glass, others specialize in areas such as fruit jars, inks, insulators, milk bottles, or pontiled medicines. Anyone with an interest in antique bottles, from junior collector to national expert, is encouraged to join the club.

The club meets at 7:30 PM on the last Tuesday of every month, at the Church of the Redeemer, 6201 Dunrobbin Drive, Bethesda, Maryland. An important feature of PBC meetings is the presentation by a guest speaker. Past speakers have included museum curators, local historians, and club members with expertise in various aspects of the hobby. Another highlight of the evening is "show and tell," where members show off recent acquisitions and old favorites. The PBC is dedicated to increasing enjoyment in the hobby as well as to preserving and disseminating historical information. Therefore, much club business is relegated to separate business meetings, which all interested club members may attend. Visitors are always welcome at the regular monthly meetings.

In addition to monthly meetings, club activities include an annual swap meet and picnic, an annual awards banquet, and publication of the monthly newsletter *The Potomac Pontil*.
